7 Moms, 7 Healthy Babies!

One of the priorities of Family Promise is to assist expectant unhoused mothers. In 2022 we welcomed 7 new children! Our special thanks to all the generous donors that provided shower gifts so that these young children have a great start in life. Family Promise networks with community agencies so mothers receive prenatal healthcare and parenting support. Special thanks to the Geneva Presbyterian Church for the welcome box they provided with numerous baby essentials!

How Does the Waiting List Work?

Each family referred to Family Promise of Ontario County for emergency housing and case management is first contacted by our Prevention Case Manager. She determines if the family can remain in their existing housing with financial assistance or if they need help paying for new housing.

If they do not have adequate resources yet to move into a permanent apartment, they would then be considered for FPOC Shelter. FPOC currently operates 8 Emergency Housing Units to shelter families: 1 in East Bloomfield, 4 in Canandaigua and 3 in Geneva. We can accommodate up to 43 adults and children at a time. This is 3 times the number of people we could serve in the Congregation Rotation Model of Shelter.

Assignments to short term emergency housing are based on family size, and the size of available units. We are committed to serving those who are most vulnerable. This means that a family living in a car, would take priority of a family living in a hotel.

There's Nothing Like Walking Across the Threshold of Your Own Apartment!



We welcomed Jeanette and her sweet baby girl into our emergency shelter program in early January. They had been through a lot, and needed a place where they could make a fresh start. She and daughter stayed in one of our Geneva apartments for just under two months, working with Case Manager Glenda Pelham. In mid-February, the Geneva Housing Authority assured us that her Section 8 Housing Choice voucher would soon be ready. Family Promise deployed Emergency Solutions Grant money to pay her first month's rent and security deposit, and Jeanette walked across the threshold of her new apartment on the first of March!

Jeanette signed her own lease with her new landlord, Joseph Furmansky. Family Promise provided assurance that we would help her be a successful tenant. On the first of April, she paid her own rent. With her Section 8 voucher, she now pays just 30% of her income for rent and utilities.

Jeanette can make it on their own now, but she knows that we have her back when she needs us!

New York's Rental Arrears Crisis: Threatening the Stability of Affordable and Public Housing

New NYHC Policy Paper

The New York Housing Conference released a policy brief on March 9, 2023 with alarming data about the rental arrears crisis in New York State that began during the pandemic. The study looks at New York's affordable housing stock, including public housing and privately-owned publicly subsidized affordable housing.

In the data set of almost 50,000 affordable housing units, 31% of households are in arrears, owing more than two months of rent. On average, each household owes more than \$9500 in unpaid rent.

These findings are reflective of a growing need for direct and immediate assistance for tenants, landlords and public housing. Earlier this year, New York closed the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP), designed to grant financial relief to renters during the COVID-19 pandemic. About 140,000 applicants did not receive any assistance before the funding ran out.

"It's clear that New Yorkers need immediate relief to address the growing arrears crisis across our state – otherwise, we will leave thousands of renters at risk of eviction and affordable developments at risk of losing financial stability," said Rachel Fee, executive director of the New York Housing Conference. "Although we applaud the Governor's plan for long-term housing growth in our state, we also understand that relief is needed right now to ensure housing stability."



NEW: Covid Mitigation Program

This grant will allow us to improve and maintain safety procedures over the next 18 months. The project will enable us to purchase a variety of personal protective equipment, cleaning services, and cleaning supplies. The project is being coordinated by CARES, NY in Albany and The University of Rochester Medical Center.

CARES, NY will visit our Day Center and Emergency Apartments in the next few weeks so they can familiarize themselves with our shelter model.


